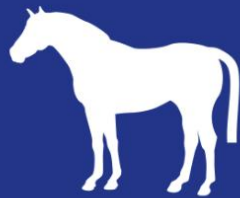

Conditions of entry:

Payment must be made at the time of entry. Failure to make payment will mean your entry will not be processed. Entries close on Friday 23rd January 2026. Late entries may be accepted after this date; however, a \$20 late entry fee will apply. Any changes to entries after processing will incur a \$10 administration fee.

Prize money:

- Prize Money can either be cash or sponsor product to the value of.
 - 1-3 Entries; 1st - \$15, 2nd - \$10, ribbons will be given to all placegetters
 - 4 or more Entries; 1st - \$20, 2nd - \$15, 3rd - \$10, unless in a special sponsored class where prize money is listed
 - Champion \$20
 - Reserve Champion \$10
 - Grand Champion Senior Exhibit \$100
 - Grand Champion Junior Exhibit \$100
 - Supreme Champion Beef Exhibit \$100
- Points: 1st - 10, 2nd - 8, 3rd - 6, 4th - 4, 5th - 2, Champion - 2, Reserve Champion - 1
(In the event of two exhibitors or more gaining equal points the exhibitor gaining the most first placings will be declared the winner.)

RULES:

1. All cattle entered in must be entered in the bona fide owner's name and be registered or eligible for registration in a recognised herd book.
2. If there are insufficient entries in any beef classes, the beef committee reserve the right to combine classes.
3. If there are more than 5 entries from any one breed in any class, a specific breed class will be added once entries are received, with no extra entry fee.
4. Age of all beef cattle is determined from 1st of June in each year and deemed to be one year older on that date. Calves at foot are to be born since 31st May.

5. Animals entered in group classes must be entered in at least one other class for what they are eligible.
6. All female cattle over one year are to have nose clips in the ring.
7. All male cattle over one year to be nose rung at all times.
8. All cattle must be from a TB free, or TB accredited and brucellosis free herd of C2 Herd Status or greater. A copy of latest herd test certificate must accompany the entry form.
9. Cattle, three months of age and over farmed or grazed within a declared TB Movement Controlled Area must be negative to a TB test within 60 days prior to the Show.
10. All cattle must be accompanied in transit by a signed and dated Declaration Card showing an Accredited TB Free Status in accordance with present legislation.
11. Every endeavour to minimize the likelihood of the spread of Mycoplasma Bovis. Please comply with all instructions on your confirmation sheet and the instructions given by your Steward.
12. It is a requirement that ALL cattle will be correctly identified using official NAIT tags as implemented on 1st July 2012 in accordance with present legislation. It is the responsibility of the livestock exhibitors to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the farm/property for the show. Your NAIT number must be stated on the entry form, or your entry will not be accepted.

Open to all beef crossed and beef/dairy crossed calves.

Class 4020 Best beef calf and handler 8 years and under

To be judged on care, condition, manners and handler's knowledge.

Class 4021 Best beef calf and handler 9 years and over

To be judged on care, condition, manners and handler's knowledge.

Beef Junior Herdsperson

To be judged at the conclusion of the breed classes but before the Grand Champion Junior and Senior Exhibit Championships

No entry fee.

Prize Money 1st \$20; 2nd \$15; 3rd \$10; 4th \$5.

- All ages are as at 31st October 2025
 - Junior - 12 years and under
 - Intermediate - 13 to 18 years
 - Senior - 19 to 24 years
- If the handler is competing in the junior section, then assistance is allowed.
- Age of animal is to be under 24 months
- Animal can be a Heifer, Bull or Steer
- Animal does not need to be owned by exhibitor
- Same animal may be used in different handler age classes
- Animal can be any beef breed or beef cross
- Classes may be run together depending on numbers, but points will be allocated for all 3 age groups as above.

To be judged at the conclusion of the Supreme Champion Beef Exhibit Championship or after the Grand Parade.

No entry fee.

Prize Money 1st \$20; 2nd \$15; 3rd \$10; 4th \$5.

- All ages are as at 31st October 2025
 - Junior - 12 years and under
 - Intermediate - 13 to 18 years
 - Senior - 19 to 24 years
- 4 animals are to be selected by the overseeing judge, who places the animals 1-4.
- Junior Judges enter the ring and judge the animals placing them from 1-4.
- Junior Judges will then speak to their placing on the public address system.
- Classes may be run together depending on numbers.

Royal Agricultural Society of NZ – Yellow Card System

The following outlines the recommended rules and implementation of the RAS Yellow Warning Card System.

1. The President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or the Chief Steward of the Section/Stand may issue a yellow warning card instead of fines or other penalties applicable as indicated in the RAS affiliated Show or Event own Rules and Regulations, to the Person Responsible (PR) – (see definition of PR at conclusion) in the following instances:

- i. Abuse of animals in any form as provided for
 - a. Equine – Rule 52 (RAS Equestrian Competitors & Judges Rule Book & Guidelines) and Article 143 (FEI General Regulations)
 - b. Dairy – as per the RAS Showing Rules & Regulations for Dairy Cattle.
 - c. All livestock, including equine & dairy – as per rule 3 under Health & Safety, RAS Showing Rules & Regulations.
- ii. Inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the RAS affiliated Show/Event, including Approved Measuring Stands and their grounds, bringing the A&P movement into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or Exhibitors as provided.
 - a. Equine – refer to RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook
 - b. All Persons Responsible, including equestrian – refer to rule 8 under Disruptive or Unacceptable Behaviour, RAS Showing Rules or Regulations
 - c. Rule 13 of the RAS Constitution. Inappropriate behaviour constitutes any behaviour deemed by the President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or the Chief Steward of the Section/Stand involved that brings the A&P movement into disrepute including but not limited to Inappropriate language, swearing, cheating or deliberately attempting to work outside of the generally accepted show rules and protocols. This also extends to inappropriate written communication via Facebook, twitter, text, on-line forums and the like

2. A yellow warning card may be delivered to the Person Responsible either by hand, post or by any other suitable means. The Person Responsible may accept or reject the yellow warning card. If the Person Responsible accepts a yellow warning card, no other penalty recorded in the RAS Bylaws or Rules & Regulations will be imposed against the Person Responsible in respect of the actions for which the yellow warning card was issued.

3. If a yellow warning card is delivered to the Person Responsible either by hand, post or any other suitable means at the RAS affiliated Show/Event or registered Measuring Stand and their grounds to which the yellow warning card relates and the Person Responsible rejects the yellow warning card, the applicable appeal/discipline procedure recorded in the RAS Complaints Procedure will be instituted.

4. If a yellow warning card is delivered to the Person Responsible after the Show/Event or registered Measuring Stand and their grounds to which the yellow carding card relates, this must be done within 10 days of the event/show/measuring appointment giving rise to the incident.

5. If a yellow warning card is delivered to the Person Responsible after the Show/Event or registered Measuring Stand and their grounds to which the yellow carding card relates, the Person Responsible may only reject the yellow warning card by sending it to the RAS within 48 hours of receipt, in which case the matter will be referred to the relevant Disputes, Protests or Hearing Committee as per the RAS Complaints Procedure.

6. As soon as possible after issuing a yellow warning card, the Show/Event/Measuring Official concerned shall forward details (but) regarding the issuing of the yellow warning card and the Person Responsible to the RAS Head Office. The RAS will support this by maintaining a register of yellow warning cards and record such details on that register.

7. If a person receives a second yellow warning card at the same or at any other Show/Event/ registered Measuring Stand and their grounds within 12 months of the first yellow warning card being issued to that person, the case shall be submitted to the RAS Hearing Committee for consideration in accordance with the RAS Complaints Procedure. In deciding the penalty to be imposed on the Person Responsible the Hearing Committee will take into consideration whether the offence for which the first yellow warning card was issued is similar to the offence causing the second yellow warning card to be issued to the same person within 12 months of the first.

8. Notwithstanding this warning card system, cases of repetition in the same type of offence within two years from the first offence shall be penalized by up to the maximum penalty foreseen for the offence in question.

9. The implementation and acceptance of the Yellow Card will always entail the disqualification of the animal and PR from the Show/Event and the forfeiture of any prize money won in the same Show/Event if applicable.

TIME OF IMPLEMENTATION OF DECISIONS

1. Decisions against which there cannot be an appeal shall be effective from the date of the notification to the persons or bodies concerned.

2. Decisions to which the parties concerned have formally renounced their right of appeal shall become effective on the date when the renunciation reaches the RAS.

3. Decisions taken by President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or the Chief Steward OR Disputes, Protests or Hearing Committee shall be effective from the moment the time limit for lodging an appeal has expired.

February 2013 Definition of Person Responsible – the person actually committing the offence whether it be abuse of animal or inappropriate behavior. In the case of the specific dairy cattle rules, the PR will be as referred to in those rules.
